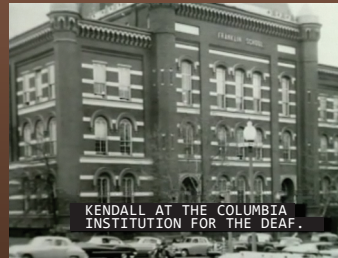

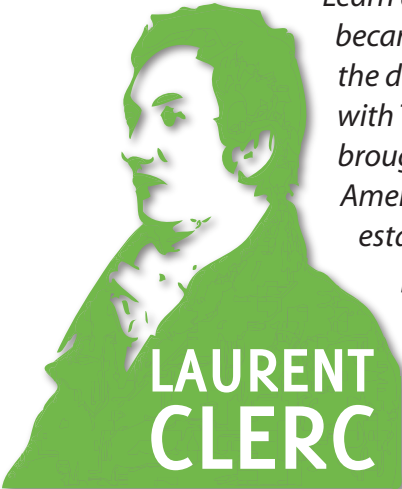

The DCMP has 20 episodes of the Emmy award-winning series from Gallaudet.

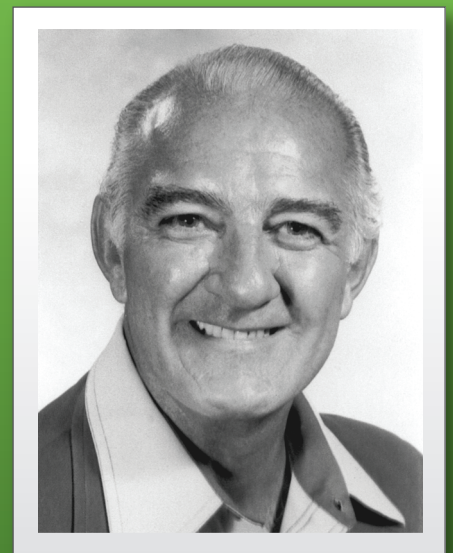
