Helen was born in Alabama and became both deaf and blind at the age of 19 months due to an illness. She was the first deaf-blind person to earn a bachelor's degree. She was an author, political activist, and lecturer.

Georgia was born blind and became deaf later in life. She first taught in public school and later became a proofreader for the Library of Congress. While working there, she taught herself ten different languages.
