# **DESCRIPTION**

Seven-year-old Breno lives in an archipelago off the coast of Brazil. Like his father, he loves diving with the dolphins near his home. Underwater photography enhances the factual information about this graceful mammal, a part of Breno's culture.

- 3. To identify a dolphin and describe its significance in this culture.

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### **BEFORE SHOWING**

- 1. Locate Fernando de Noronha, a group of islands in the northeast of Brazil. Ask on what continent Brazil is located. Show where Brazil is in relation to the rest of the world.
- 2. Discuss general characteristics of Brazil such as its size, geography, climate, natural resources, culture, etc.
- 3. Identify a favorite pet or animal friend. Are there animals that help students or their community? How? Are there animals that are both helpers and pets?

# **AFTER SHOWING**

#### **Discussion Items and Questions**

- 1. Describe Breno's family. Describe their home. What do Breno's parents do? Why is his father classifying the dolphins on the island? Why does he need official permission to go near them? Where does Breno's father do his research?
- 2. Is the dolphin a fish? How does it breathe? What enables the dolphin to navigate among its companions and larger objects? Do dolphins travel alone or in groups? How fast can they swim?
- 3. Compare and contrast your daily routine with Breno's. What similarities and differences are there? How are activities with his family like or unlike yours? How does the way he spends his leisure time compare to the way you spend yours? Compare his method of celebration of a major event with your style of celebration.

#### **Applications and Activities**

1. Dolphins almost constantly emit either clicking sounds or whistles. Research to discover what the two kinds of sounds represent. Some investigators have suggested that dolphins might be capable of learning a true language and communicating with humans. Prepare a report on the latest research into dolphin

intelligence from Hawaii's Kewalo Basin Marine Mammal Laboratory.

2. Dolphins were once hunted commercially. Find out why. Many dolphins have been accidentally destroyed in other ways. Find out how. What happened as a result of a tuna boycott? What is the Marine Mammal Protection Act?
