2009 PEPNet Postsecondary Interpreting and Speech-to-Text Survey Summary

PEPNet gets frequent requests for information about interpreter/speech-to-text position development. Determining or analyzing a salary is often part of this challenge and we trust the following information will be helpful to postsecondary programs. This is the sixth survey produced by PEPNet-Midwest and the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee; the first three were very small projects, and the survey and results have gotten significantly more detailed each time we survey our colleagues.

During 2009 123 campus representatives participated in our survey. These postsecondary staff tend to be members of the PEPNet listserv, have long histories of serving students who are deaf or hard of hearing, and might have participated in past surveys.



- Raise hiring standards
- Compare salaries/wages
- Create/review new and existing accessibility policies
- Determine best practices for your campus
- Find/contact similar programs
- Improve services for students

As you use this data, please bear in mind that the document offers a snapshot of an institution at the moment someone filled out the survey. This information is dynamic: each situation could be different tomorrow, and different again next week, in some cases.





Approximately 75% of the institutions have 1-5 full time equivalent positions assisting with services to deaf/hard of hearing students.



Of the institutions providing interpreting services, over 50% of them cover between 11 – 100 hours weekly.




Can you cover all of your interpreting needs with STAFF interpreters?



Fourteen percent (17 campuses) of all respondents providing interpreting services state they are able to cover 100% of their interpreting needs with STAFF interpreters.

Who provides the interpreting services?



In other words, of all the interpreting required for the 108 campuses which answered this question, 42% of those hours are covered by staff interpreters, 10% by freelance/private practice interpreters, 15% by agencies and 3% other. 




Interpreter Agency Rates




Video Remote Interpreting




Video REMOTE Interpreting Rates






46 campuses reported exclusive use of only one type of speech-to-text service to cover all of their needs. Twenty four use only CART, 14 use only C-Print and 8 use only TypeWell.

In other words, of all the speech-to-text needs required for the 70 campuses which answered this question, 45% of those hours are covered by staff freelance/private practice captionists, 32% by agencies, 22% by staff and 1% other.





Dual Service Providers


Of the 24 institutions who stated they have staff speech-to-text providers, 15 said they had 1-5 dual service providers, people who can both interpret and caption.



NOTE: Three campuses said dual service providers are paid more for having an additional skill.



REMOTE Speech-to-Text Services Rates




Speech-to-Text Programmatic Questions

Use of transcripts:




Voice Recognition Software

Thirteen campuses use voice recognition software to provide classroom speech-to-text services and seven use it to make transcripts for post production captioning.




